Solutions to End Homelessness Program



The Solutions to End Homelessness Program (STEHP) currently has funding available.

STEHP can assist households at risk of homelessness by preventing the loss of housing with short term rental subsidy & ongoing support services.

Eligibility is based on the following:

- The applicant is at risk of losing housing (facing eviction/given a pay or quit notice/ eviction paperwork)
- The rent is affordable & reasonable
- The applicant household income is at or below 30% AMI(see chart below)

Family Size	30% AMI
1	\$22,300
2	\$25,500
3	\$28,700
4	\$31,850
5	\$35,140
6	\$40,280
7	\$45,420
8	\$50,560

*Applicants already assisted by a government rental subsidy (ex. Public Housing or Housing Choice Voucher Program) are not eligible for STEHP prevention funds.

Note: The Landlord must be willing to accept payment for up to 3 months of arrears and three months of ongoing rental assistance and stop the eviction process
